# 11 January 2015 the baptism of the Lord (OF year B & EF) the holy family (EF)

I am sure many of you either for work or school have done some kind of personality inventory. The most famous one is the Meyers-Briggs personality test, which, based on your answers to a whole series of questions, evaluates you as: extrovert/introvert, sensing/intuitive, thinking/feeling, and judging/perceiving. I always come out as ENTJ, and am shocked at how accurate it is, at least for me. Every personality type has its strengths and its weaknesses, and if we understand others' personality types it can often help us to be more effective communicators with them.

In the Middle Ages, people posited that personality was the result of a preponderance of a particular kind of fluid in the body: yellow bile, black bile, blood or phlegm. This made you choleric, sanguine, melancholic or phlegmatic. Many saints were identified as belonging to one group or another: St Peter was sanguine, St Paul was choleric, St John of the Cross melancholic, and so forth.

Human beings have always sought to understand why we are often so different from each other. From a psychological perspective, it appears that both genetics and upbringing are powerful influences on how we think, act and see the world. Culture, language, and socioeconomic opportunity are undeniable factors on how we live and move in the world. Morally speaking, we can say that we have a certain stable character that manifests itself in certain inclinations to both virtues and vices. Our faith reminds us that, even with all of this conditioning from nature or nurture, we do have free will. And apart from serious mental illness, it means that we have to exercise our free will for the good, both the common good, and for our ultimate good, union with God.

At the same time though, charity requires us to try to understand the other person, whether that person be our significant other, the jerk who cut us off on the interstate (oops, my choleric is showing, I guess), or our coworkers. In a church environment, we have to be sensitive that not everyone receives or interprets everything in the same way, or according to the intention of the giver. I am reminded of this when I preach. The same words of the same homily may be received in wildly different ways by different people: maybe someone is at a place in her life where she received just the right amount of challenge and consolation, another person may going through so much crisis in his life that any mention of certain things will set him off into a tailspin, yet another may hate the messenger and reject the message on principle. All of these things are part of our life, even in church.

St Thomas Aquinas reminds us, *Grace perfects nature*. The human person is a complex, often dysfunctional and hard to interpret creature. For society to work requires us to bear with each other and be patient. Divine assistance helps us to be more simple, to not take ourselves too seriously, and to seek out the gifts of God that can elevate our human nature to union with Christ. But we must be patient with one another, seek to understand each other, and then pray and sacrifice for each other. If the parish is a school of the Lord's service, then we grow together in grace by bearing one another's burdens, being patient with one another, and rejoicing in our common sonship in Love. 


