From 18 January to 25 January, the Catholic Church and ecclesial communities of separated brethren celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The week starts on the Feast of the Chair of St Peter at Antioch (which we continue to celebrate in the Extraordinary Form but was dropped in the Liturgical Reform after Vatican II, which only retains the Feast of Chair of St Peter at Rome on 22 February) and closes on the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul the Apostle.

The Week was the brainchild of Paul Wattson, an Anglican convert to the Catholic Church who founded the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement to work for the reconciliation of non-Catholic Christians to the ancient faith. Pope St Pius X blessed the idea, and it has been celebrated ever since. The Second Vatican Council (1962-5) proposed that ecumenism, the movement towards unity, is part of the essence of the Church.

There is, of course, a true ecumenism and a false ecumenism. Authentic ecumenism encourages Christians to pray for unity, and to recognize where elements of unity already exist. A false ecumenism, however, seeks an illusory unity at the cost of the essentials of the faith. This type of ecumenism downplays the truth that the Catholic Church was founded by Christ and she alone possesses the fullness of truth, and instead focuses almost entirely on those elements of truth that exist outside her.

Ecumenism is a matter not only of good will and cooperation between Christians, but also serious theological dialogue and debate. There is a way in which Christians who have been separated from the See of Peter may be united, but not absorbed into the Catholic Church. Just here in Greenville, we have Eastern Rite Catholics who are fully Catholic, in union with the Apostolic See, but who have their own ritual and spiritual traditions. We also have here the fruit of one of the most recent ecumenical initiatives, the Anglican Ordinariate.

In 2009, Pope Benedict XVI established a structure where Anglicans and Episcopalians who ascribed to the fullness of the Catholic faith could come into union with Rome without renouncing those ritual and spiritual traditions developed in the 500 years of their separation from Rome, which were not at variance with the essence of the faith. The Anglican patrimony includes a wealth of sacred music, beautiful liturgy, and sound spirituality that enriches the already incredibly diverse Catholic Church. Two members of our staff, Christopher Bourne and Evan Simington, are Catholic members of the Ordinariate.

We must always work energetically in charity to reconcile to the Catholic Church those disciples of the Lord who have never known her or who have left her. This week, let's begin to do that by saying every day:

ANTIPHON: That they all may be one, as Thou, Father, in Me and I in Thee; that they also may be one in Us; that the world may believe that Thou hast sent Me. (John 17:21)

V.I say unto thee that thou art Peter, R. And upon this Rock I will build My Church.

Let us pray: O Lord Jesus Christ, Who saidst unto Thine Apostles, Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you, regard not our sins, but the faith of Thy Church, and vouchsafe to grant unto Her that peace and unity which are agreeable to Thy Will Who livest and reignest, God, forever and ever. Amen.

For this reason, the instinct of our faith has always been to maximize the beauty of the liturgy and its diverse furnishings and surroundings, yearning for what is to come rather than indulging in backwards glances.
