I don't know about you, but I can find Lent awfully tough at times. Every year I make something akin to a New Year's Resolution, to abstain from some good thing for 40 days or to take on some extra penance. And then I invariably talk about it with a bunch of other people doing similar things, and we usually end up telling stories of our failures, because, well, if we told the stories of our successes, how could we gain the merit from a practice which is supposed to develop in us, the virtue of humility?

But, what if, in our parish family, we were not just isolated individuals each doing his/her own thing, and feeling awfully lonely and weak about it? What if, as a parish family, we all celebrate Lent together this year and support each other in our Lenten journey towards Easter?

Soon, you will get a chance to see a booklet I have prepared called *The Shape of Lent at POP 2015*. In it, I propose that as a parish family we all do certain Lenten practices and extra Bible readings together, instead of each one doing something different. Of course, you are all free to do whatever you want, but I warmly encourage all of you to enter into this Lent as a corporate expression of our unity in Christ.

So how does this work? Each week of Lent we will have a different focus. Each week will have a different set of Scripture readings to meditate on and focusing on a different theme. Each week will also have its own penance. So, instead of giving up coffee for 40 days, we will all together give up coffee or alcohol during the Fourth Week of Lent as we read Scripture passages from the prophets related to our continuing conversion in Christ. Instead of giving up Facebook or the movies for all of Lent, we will give up entertainment and technology during the Fifth Week of Lent, and read about the life and teachings of Christ.

We are always better together. And I think that, if as many people as possible in our parish, band together on the same Lenten journey, as well as coming to the usual Lenten devotional services and daily Mass and the like, we can celebrate a truly beautiful Lent. It makes us part of something beyond ourselves. Think about the conversations it can spark with friends and family, especially as you all go through it together. It is even something you can share with non-Catholic friends!

I am looking forward to sharing Lent with you all this year, and not just off in my own corner trying to do it alone. We can all this year, support each other in a common effort and come closer to Jesus, as one parish family.

Q. If I have committed a mortal sin, and can't get to confession, can't I just say an Act of Contrition and then go to Communion anyway?

A. The clear teaching of the Catholic Church was defined at the Council of Trent that this is not possible, except where there is a emergency in which there is no possible way to go to confession, and one possesses perfect contrition for one's sins:

canon 11: If anyone says that faith alone is sufficient preparation for receiving the sacrament of the most Holy Eucharist, let him be anathema. And, lest so great a sacrament be received unworthily and hence unto death and condemnation, this Holy Council determines and decrees that those whose conscience is burdened with mortal sin, no matter how contrite they may think they are, first must necessarily make a sacramental confession if a confessor is available. If anyone presumes to teach or preach or obstinately maintain or defend in public disputation the opposite of this, he shall by the very fact be excommunicated.


