Before I became a priest, I really had no idea how church finances work. I quickly realized though, that salaries, insurance and preventive maintenance programs eat up a huge portion of any church budget before the money that can be used for programming. Whenever preventive maintenance is lacking, then costs become astronomical to fix things.

Your weekly offertory budget goes to the day-to-day operations of Prince of Peace. Each year the Finance Council proposes a budget which will cover all of the expense identified as probable during the upcoming year. During the Parish Master Planning process and in my conversations with many of you about what you envision being, we have been able to get a sense of what many in the parish want. Assigning a cost to that is often a difficult process, but a necessary one. According to our budget, we need at least \$25,000 in order to bring about everything that we need to do and what the parishioners have identified that they want for their parish.

Many of you have been giving sacrificially for many years, and we are profoundly grateful for that week in and week out sacrifice. But we also have some who have not brought their financial commitment to their parish family to prayer. We need for everyone to really ask if what they are doing is in accord with the Biblical standard of the tithe. When we fail in this, who suffers? You do, because we cannot do what we need to do as a parish.

In addition to the weekly offertory that covers the usual expenses of parish life, we also have capital needs. These are those one time expenses like buildings, large maintenance projects and the like. They are not usually paid for out of the weekly offertory, but by special capital fundraising campaigns. As we looked at the Parish Master Plan, I was insistent that the first phase of the Master Plan have a balance between addressing the needs of both school and parish. Our Parish Master Planning Committee has done an exhaustive study and consultative process to come up with what that plan can look like. We do have a significant amount of capital in the bank, but that is reserved to meeting those needs as quickly and as flexibly as possible. But when those capital projects are brought to completion, the ongoing support and maintenance of those structures passes to the weekly offertory budget. That reserve capital is not something we want to use for today's expenses, because it is geared towards the Prince of Peace of the future.

If you consider Prince of Peace to truly be your spiritual home, and based on what many of you have said what you want your parish to provide for you, then please remember that there is a price tag to that. If you have specific questions about what that means, Chris Bourne, our Director of Administration and Finance, is always willing to work with you. Please do not make assumptions based on gossip, because I can guarantee they are probably wrong. It has been a pleasure to work with such a fine Finance Council. They are a great resource of advice and support, and have been very prudent and judicious in their counsel.

Stewardship is a way of life. It means that we open our hearts to generosity in everything we do, knowing that, the more we give to God and to the works of God, the more God will reward us. Make an act of faith to give your finances over to God, and map out how you can support your parish family's weekly offertory and capital needs. And also never forget to support the communal charitable endeavors of the parish, like St Vincent de Paul, which provides direct assistance to the poor and underprivileged in our community. God will reward you if you do His will!

## regulations for fast and abstinence:

**Fasting** is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

**Abstinence** is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

**Ash Wednesday (18 Feb.), Good Friday, (3 April), and all Fridays of lent are days of fast and abstinence.** Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or renewal of baptismal vows at Easter.

### bishop's annual appeal:

**what is it?** The BAA is a primary source of funding to help sustain and expand ministries in the 95 parishes, 21 missions, 33 Catholic Schools, and agencies throughout the diocese. Each parish and mission is asked to participate in this worthy appeal.

### How are parish BAA targets determined?

It is an objective formula based on a parish's annual assessable income. Each parish is assigned a percentage, or fair share, of the overall \$3,000,000 goal as their BAA parish target. This percentage is the same percentage that their parish assessment represents compared to the overall diocesan assessment. For example, if a parish's annual diocesan assessment represents 1% of the overall diocesan assessment amount, then their BAA target will represent 1% of the \$3,000,000 overall goal.

Prince of Peace BAA goal for 2015 is \$ 61,462.
