

from the business manager: Starting last summer, you have probably noticed a large number of projects going on around the parish. From clearing the retention pond and waste lot at the back of the property to demolishing the old farmhouse and its outbuildings, major landscaping around campus, and painting Croghan Hall. We've also had a number of unplanned projects that highlight the age of our facilities – such as repairing the water line that feeds Croghan Hall and the school. And there's much more to do!

In the near future we will have to replace both large heating and air conditioning units in the PAC – a major expense of nearly \$50,000. We knew this was coming but had hoped to put off a bit longer to give us time to set aside more funds. The gas heating elements in each unit have reached the end of their service lives and are not repairable. The cooling units are functioning now, but we anticipate a major breakdown of one or both in the coming year. So we are going to replace both of them this spring.

In the church, we also have to repair the flat sections of the roof (the wing roofs) above the nave – a very expensive project given the height. After months of examination, we are confident we have traced the source of the water that drips into the cry room to the upper roof on the Brushy Creek side of the church. The roof on the PAC side isn't leaking yet, but it is in the same condition. So to save on equipment, crew and material expense, we will have both replaced at the same time. That repair will cost \$26,000.

As you prayerfully reflect on your weekly offering, please consider the high expense of maintaining your parish facilities and grounds.
