It has been almost 100 years since Our Lady appeared to three small children at Fatima in Portugal. The Church is always very reticent about approving Marian apparitions, and no Catholic is bound to believe in any of them, even if they are approved. But, numerous Popes have spoken of the message of Fatima, and that it continues to be valid for our day. One of the most interesting things that the Blessed Mother did was show the little Francisco, Jacinta and Lucia, a vision of hell, and asked the children to do penance and pray for the conversion of sinners. Another terrifying aspect of the message is that Our Lady spoke of mass apostasy within the Church, where even at the highest levels of the hierarchy, men of God would deny the truths of the Faith.

We live in an age where Islamic fundamentalists are killing Christians and Jews daily by the thousands. An age in which vice is called virtue, and sin is not only celebrated, but protected by law. An age in which cardinals and bishops have called for us to ignore the words of Christ on the indissolubility of marriage. It is an incredible time of history, and the apocalyptic message of Fatima rings true to believers.

So what can we do?

What does Mary tell us? Pray and do penance. Our Lady has given us the great gift of the Rosary, and she wants us to use it. We should pray the Rosary, not just sometimes, but every day. Pope Francis prays all twenty mysteries of the Rosary every day! The Rosary is a great prayer to say just about anywhere, and if you don't have one, you can use your fingers to count out the Hail Mary's! Our families should always pray the Rosary, so that children grow up doing it from the time they are little. They will need that prayer during their lives.

There are times in which we are not sure how to pray, or what to pray, but we know that we need to pray. When we pray the Rosary attentively and devoutly, we meditate on the life of Jesus and ask His Mother to intercede with us on behalf of the whole world. The Rosary is not a gang symbol or something to hang from your rear view mirror; it is a powerful weapon of peace and love, a weapon that Mary has put in your hands to help defeat Satan and usher in the triumph of her Immaculate Heart. Pray the Rosary!!!!

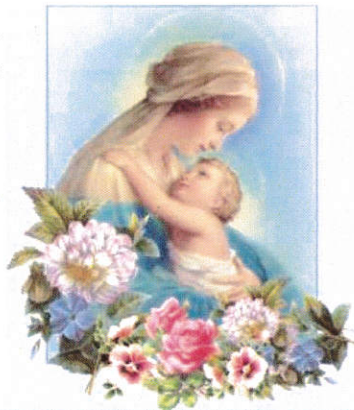
please note there will be no confessions this Wednesday, 13 May due to Confirmation.
