24 may 2015 pentecost sunday(OF year B & EF)

We pray often for vocations to the priesthood and religious life here at Prince of Peace, but how many of you have ever actually seen an ordination to the priesthood? This Friday at St Mary's downtown at 6p, Bishop Guglielmone will ordain Roger Morgan and Rich Wilson to the sacred priesthood. This is a great opportunity to experience the beautiful and rich ceremony in which a man is set apart for God by this sacrament of Holy Orders. Newly minted Father Morgan will celebrate a First Solemn Mass at St Mary's at 11a on the following Sunday morning, and I plan on being in attendance, along with other sons from the parish who have been ordained to the priesthood. It will be a joyful moment, not only to welcome a new priest into the Diocese, but to celebrate the gift of the priesthood to the entire church. To see so many priests around their Bishop, at the Chrism Mass or Ordinations, is always an impressive sight.

Today, we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin in the Upper Room. Pentecost is the third most important feast in the Church after Easter and Christmas, and ushers in the age of the Church, born from the side of Christ on the Cross and sent forth into the world to baptize, to preach and teach at Pentecost.

It is a good reminder that, at the end of these 50 days of Eastertide, where we celebrate that we have been washed, that now we are sent. Sent on mission. The Apostles, and their successors, the Bishops and Priests, have a specific mission to teach, govern and sanctify the People of God. But all of us, as disciples of Christ, have a mission to share the Good News as well. The missionary nature of the Church is its inner nature; we all participate in it. Whenever we leave Mass at Prince of Peace, we don't just go back home, or to our workplaces, or to ordinary life. We are sent forth into our mission field, into a world which needs the peace that passes understanding.

We certainly all need some Holy Ghost power to fulfill that mission. So it is important that we have, alongside our personal relationship with Jesus as Lord, a personal relationship with the Holy Spirit. In these days in which we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, let us pray fervently for an outpouring of the Spirit's gifts upon us that we may do His work, and set the world on fire with love for God.
