all saints (OF year B & EF)**

As Catholics, we have a great love for the Pope. But it is important to know what the Church actually teaches about the papal office. Occasionally I come across people who think that the Pope is an absolute monarch and can do whatever he wants. Or those who agree with one Pope, and will assert that anything that comes out of his mouth is revealed by the Holy Spirit because they like him, and then turn around and ignore everything another Pope says because they don't like him.

Pope Benedict XVI described the office beautifully: "**The Pope is not an absolute monarch whose thoughts and desires are law.** On the contrary: the Pope's ministry is a guarantee of obedience to Christ and to his Word. **He must not proclaim his own ideas,** but rather constantly bind himself and the Church to obedience to God's Word, in the face of every attempt to adapt it or water it down, and **every form of opportunism.** The Pope knows that in his important decisions, he is bound to the **great community of faith of all times, to the binding interpretations** that have developed throughout the Church's pilgrimage. Thus, his power is not being above, but at the service of, the Word of God. It is incumbent upon him to ensure that this Word continues to be present in its greatness and to resound in its purity, so that it is not torn to pieces by continuous changes in usage."

When the Pope definitively teaches what the Church has always taught on faith and morals, we are bound to assent to that teaching if we are to call ourselves faithful Catholics. If a Pope advances a theological opinion or political policy in a private manner, or even in his office as Roman Pontiff, we are not bound to that level of assent. We are bound to respect him, but we can also prudently disagree. If a Pope changes one of the disciplines of the Church, we are free to agree or disagree about that change, but we still must remain respectful.

In the 19th century, the increased visibility of the Pope in media led many Catholics to a somewhat exaggerated opinion of the papal office called *ultramontanism*. This current made the Pope and his person central to Catholic faith and life in a way it never was before. The doctrine of papal infallibility was declared at this time, and we have had a series of incredible men on the throne of Peter ever since, and, with increasing rapidity of communications, the Pope has become more present in the life of Catholics as he ever was.

But we now have a bizarre situation in which some Catholics claim that mere opinions or policies of a pope are as binding as the truths of the Gospel and the Creed, even when those opinions and policies change between one papacy and another. It is intellectually and theologically incoherent to act as if the Pope were an oracle of divine wisdom. Such has never been the teaching of the Church, and is a caricature of it. I get shivers when I hear Catholics act as if the Holy Spirit personally chooses each Pope and makes his every act infallible. It's not the teaching of Christ, or of the Church. We are not papolaters, and we are not papists. We are Catholics, and the ancient faith is entrusted to Peter's successors to hand on from one generation to the next, whole and entire. Anything outside of that is worthy of respect, but does not bind our conscience. Adrian Fortescue's work *The Early Papacy* shows how the Catholic teaching on Petrine primacy developed early, and how it is opposed to ultramontane exaggeration.

prayer & worship

a plenary indulgence for souls in purgatory: A plenary indulgence wipes away the sins holding a soul in purgatory and the effects of the sin (in other words you can speed their way through purgatory into heaven) may be gained for a soul in purgatory by doing the following: 1) go to confession within 10 days of the act; 2) go to communion on the day of the act (better in the context of the Mass but not necessary); 3) pray for the intentions of the Pope on the day of the act (normally an Our Father, Hail Mary and Apostles Creed (many use the Glory Be instead of the Creed); 4) have a detachment to sin, even venial sin (in other words trying hard not to commit a recurring sin); 5) visit a cemetery (there is one on the corner of Brushy Creek and Old Spartanburg Rd) and pray for the departed - this is the act. Each day you repeat this between Nov 1-8 can send a soul to heaven. It can only be applied to one soul each day it is done. You have the potential to send 8 souls to heaven next week. So get to confession next Wednesday or this Monday after Mass if you did not go on Saturday.

One sacramental Confession suffices for all the plenary indulgences done within 10 days, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions and a separate visit to a cemetery are required for each plenary indulgence. Only one can be granted per day - make your deceased loved ones the happiest people in purgatory as they leave for heaven. Should they already be in heaven the indulgence will be applied to another as it will if they are in the other place where the indulgence cannot be used.

november is the month of all souls: Please forward to Maria Rauch the names of those of your loved ones who have died since All Souls 2014 so they can be read out loud before the 7p Mass on Monday, 2 November. We will have a Board of Remembrance at the St Joseph Altar, which will be set up as a Requiem Altar for the month of November. Please bring copies of photos of your loved ones to pin to the board. At the end of the month of November, the Board will be taken down and the pictures will be collected and stored in the Parish Office.

There will be a candle placed on St Joseph's Altar for each parishioner who has died since All Souls Day last year. After the month of November, family members are asked to pick up the candle from the Parish Office.

all souls day is Monday, 2 November. Masses to pray for the souls of the just who are being prepared for the glorious vision of God will be at 7a, 8.30a school Mass, 12p Latin and 7p Latin. All registered households have an envelope for All Souls Day (in with Sept/Oct. envelopes) with several spaces on the back for you to write the names of your beloved deceased. Please complete and drop the envelope in any collection during the month of October, so that those names will be placed on the altar of remembrance on All Souls Day and every Mass throughout the month of November. **There is an All Souls day envelope in the bulletin this week that can be dropped in the basket today or used for the offertory tomorrow.**

prayer for all the faithful departed God, Creator and Redeemer of all the faithful, grant to the souls of Your servants and handmaids the forgiveness of all their sins. Through our devout prayers may they obtain the pardon which they have always desired. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
