A few weeks ago in my bulletin column I wrote about how, about 100 years ago, the ancient order of receiving the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) was reversed. I explored how our religious education has used the sacraments in a carrot-and-stick routine to ensure some modicum of faith instruction before many children go and never practice the faith again. Many priests and catechists are terrified that, if they don't delay Confirmation as late as possible, children won't get anything at all.

I think part of the problem is that, as Catholics, we have forgotten that Christian formation begins with Baptism and has to last our whole life long. The primary educators of children are their parents. The parish church does nothing more than support families in that work. No religious education program, no matter how well designed it is, can make up for families who do not practice their faith. All of the statistics we are receiving now bear this fact out.

Some dioceses are restoring the ancient order of the sacraments of initiation and calling on their families to disengage catechesis from the sacraments. Catechesis is something for the whole family. Interestingly enough, many of our Protestant brothers and sisters understand this. Sunday School is for everyone, from little children in the nursery to the senior adult class. Everyone comes and studies the Bible in a formal class of instruction, before going to the main worship service. And Catholics still wonder why their Baptist friends know the Bible more than they do! Well, our separated brothers know that studying the faith is a life-long discipline that is part and parcel of being a Christian. They put a lot of time, talent and treasure into the study of the Word.

Now, I ask you, why should it be only Protestants that do this? Imagine a Sunday morning where you and your entire family spend an hour in age specific classrooms studying the faith: the Word of God, the Sacraments, the Liturgy, Church history, moral theology, spirituality. And then the whole assembly comes together as one to celebrate the Lord's Day with the Most Holy Eucharist!

I am not making any plans at this time to change what we do at Prince of Peace on a Sunday morning. We don't have the facilities to do that if we wanted to do so, or the staff to teach at that level. And I think most people are pretty happy with the Mass times as they are. But why not think outside the box?

What would happen if we made Christian formation and worship the center of our Lord's Day? What would happen if everyone who called Prince of Peace their spiritual home had an hour of formation every week as well as Mass together? What if all of our people arranged their lives around being together as a church family, around the Table of the Word in study and the Altar of the Eucharist at Mass, and not try to fit Mass in among a whole host of other things on a Sunday?

I want you to think about how much more well formed our Catholics would be, and how much more united our parish would be as a result? Are we willing to make the sacrifices necessary to be a parish, not just of a random collection of individuals that pass through the doors once a week, but a family of believers of one heart and mind.

our lady of mount carmel feast day 16 July

This prayer to Our Lady of Mount Carmel derives from an antiphon, "Flos Carmeli" ("The Flower of Carmel"), composed by St. Simon Stock (c. 1165-1265). St. Simon Stock is said to have received the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (commonly called "the Brown Scapular") from the Blessed Virgin Mary herself, when she appeared to him on 16 July 1251 (now the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel).

This prayer, therefore, is often tied to the Brown Scapular and is also recited as a novena before the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.



A Prayer to Our Lady of Mount Carmel

O most beautiful Flower of Mount Carmel, fruitful vine, splendor of Heaven, Blessed Mother of the Son of God, Immaculate Virgin, assist me in this my necessity. O Star of the Sea, help me and show me herein that you are my Mother.

O Holy Mary, Mother of God, Queen of Heaven and earth, I humbly beseech you from the bottom of my heart, to succor me in this my necessity. There are none that can withstand your power. O show me herein that you are my Mother.

O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us that have recourse to thee. (3 times)


