Who can receive Holy Communion at a Catholic Mass?

1. *You have to be validly baptized.* Because Baptism is the entryway to the Church, and by it, we become children of God and heirs to heaven, Communion belongs to those who have been washed in the blood of the Lamb.

2. *You have to be in full communion with the Catholic Church.* The Church makes the Eucharist and the Eucharist makes the Church. The Church is most fully who she is at the Sacrifice of the Mass. Ordinarily, non-Catholics are not allowed to receive Holy Communion. Why? Well, if you are a Protestant, for example, you do not believe that the Eucharist is what the Church says it is. You reject the dogma of transubstantiation. If you do believe that the Eucharist is what the Catholic Church says it is, the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ, then why would you belong to a church that says the opposite? Why would you not be a Catholic? Not allowing a Protestant or a non-Christian to receive Communion is not meant to exclude them. It is meant to respect their belief, namely, that the Eucharist is not what the Catholic Church says it is. Sacramental communion presupposes ecclesial communion: you are fully a part of the family, and so you come to table with that family.

3. *You do not obstinately reject any of the Church's teachings.* We are always allowed to respectfully disagree on discipline, or on prudential matters in the Church's life, but we cannot disagree on those articles of faith and morals which have been revealed by God and taught definitively by the Church as such. If you do not believe in what the Church teaches on faith and morals, why be Catholic at all? If you think she can err on one aspect of teaching, why should any of it be true? In saying, *Amen*, after Communion, we say that we believe not only that the consecrated bread is the Body of Christ, we make a profession of faith in everything the Body of Christ believes as definitively taught by God. Questioning is one thing, rejecting is another.

4. *You are not in the state of mortal sin.* For a sin to be mortal, it requires three things: a grave matter, consent of the will and sufficient deliberation. If we commit a mortal sin, it kills the soul. Just as you cannot give food to a dead body, the soul does not receive nourishment when it is dead. One has to be restored to life, through the Sacrament of Penance, before approaching the Author of Life who is received in Holy Communion.

Saint Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 11.27-32: *So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup. For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves. That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep. But if we were more discerning with regard to ourselves, we would not come under such judgment. Nevertheless, when we are judged in this way by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we will not be finally condemned with the world.*

If we realize that we are not baptized, not in full communion with the Catholic Church, reject the teachings of the Church or are in the state of mortal sin, we have a grave duty to remove the obstacle in our way before we present ourselves at the Communion Rail. If not, Saint Paul reminds us, we will have to answer to God.

quick question: The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that if a person makes a “perfect” act of contrition, his mortal sins are forgiven if he has the firm amendment to go to sacramental confession as soon as possible. Does this mean that a person in the pew at Sunday morning Mass, after supposedly making a perfect act of contrition, can receive the Eucharist at that Mass?

Answer: First, to clarify, the Catechism speaks of “perfect contrition,” not a “perfect act of contrition.” This is an important distinction because it is not a perfect act (e.g., reciting an act of contrition prayer perfectly) that obtains the forgiveness of grave sins; it is the contrition itself that must be perfect.

Contrition is defined as “sorrow of the soul and detestation for the sin committed, together with the resolution not to sin again” (CCC1451). Contrition may be imperfect or perfect.

Imperfect contrition, which does not obtain forgiveness of grave sins, “is born of the consideration of sin’s ugliness or the fear of eternal damnation and the other penalties threatening the sinner” (CCC1453).

Perfect contrition, on the other hand, “arises from a love by which God is loved above all else” (CCC 1452). Only this form of contrition obtains the forgiveness of grave sins before going to confession.

Since perfect contrition obtains the forgiveness of grave sins, one who makes an act of perfect contrition may receive the Eucharist under certain conditions. The *Code of Canon Law* states: *A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make*

an act of perfect contrition, which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible. (CIC 916)

Note that there are four conditions that must be fulfilled before going to Communion:

- 1) There must be a grave reason to receive Communion (e.g., danger of death).
- 2) It must be physically or mentally impossible to go to confession first.
- 3) The person must already be in a state of grace through perfect contrition.
- 4) The person must resolve to go to confession as soon as possible.

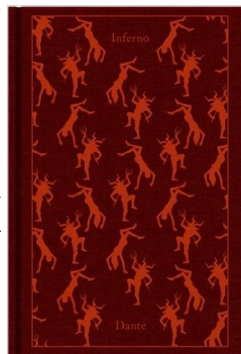
