Ideas have consequences, and sometimes the consequences become such a part of our lives that we do not recognize where the ideas which generated them came from. Ancient philosophers held that certain things possess a nature common to them. Jack, Susan and Pedro are all individuals, but they share a common human nature. There is something about being *human* that they all participate in. The 14th century English thinker William of Ockham, however, thought that we just assign a name to things that seem similar to us. Human is then just a name we assign to Jack, Susan and Pedro because there is something about them which seems similar to us. This is rather an important shift, from things sharing a nature, to nature just being a human construct.

On the eve of the Enlightenment, Rene Descartes argued, *I think, therefore I am*, enshrining the idea that reality is somehow in the perception of the individual. Nature, far from something individuals of a certain class share in, created by God, had become something entirely interior, and entirely subjective.

Living in a post-modern world means that these late medieval and early modern ideas are such a part of the way we look at the world that we scarcely stop to think of them. They are a far cry from the wisdom of the ancient and biblical world, which saw nature as an ordered, objective creation of God, outside the self. These two fundamentally opposing world views are at the heart of so many conflicts we have in society today. Even though there are remnants of that previous world view, different ideas that have consequences have prevailed in society, government and law. Sex, marriage and family life are no different.

So where can we find the essence of sex, marriage and family life? Well, if you adopt the modern subjectivist, individualistic world view, there is no nature in which all sex, marriage and family life participates. Sex, marriage and family life can have as many combinations as the individual sees as instrumental in his happiness.

The teaching of the Catholic Church, however, is that there is such a thing as a nature for sex, marriage and family life. There are objective truths about all three: some of which are accessible to human reason on its own, and others, which are knowable only under the light of divine revelation.

Those truths which are accessible to human reason are not the special preserve of the Catholic faith; they are the common patrimony of humanity. One of those truths is that the reason the sexual act exists is for procreation. That does not mean that there are not other aspects, or elements, that can be had along with it (pleasure, psychological bonding, spiritual union). But it does mean that the reason why sex exists rather than does not exist, is for the continuation of the species. History shows that societies have always privileged stable unions between parents as the best means of raising children and integrating them into a virtuous society that seeks the good. That does not mean that children who have been raised outside of such unions are by that fact unable to be raised well and integrate well into society. But even in times and places where alternatives to what most of us see as "traditional marriage" were prevalent, the fundamental unit of parents and child has been seen as a positive good, and society has always sought to protect and encourage it.

st sharbel makhlef feast day is 24 july



Joseph Zaroun Makluf was raised by an uncle because his father, a mule driver, died when Joseph was only three. At the age of 23, Joseph joined the Monastery of St. Maron at Annaya, Lebanon, and took the name Sharbel in honor of a second-century martyr. He professed his final vows in 1853 and was ordained six years later.

Following the example of the fifth-century St. Maron, Sharbel lived as a hermit from 1875 until his death. His reputation for holiness prompted people to seek him to receive a blessing and to be remembered in his prayers. He followed a strict fast and was very devoted to the Blessed Sacrament. When his superiors occasionally asked him to administer the sacraments to nearby villages, Sharbel did so gladly.

He died in the late afternoon on Christmas Eve. Christians and non-Christians soon made his tomb a place of pilgrimage and of cures. Pope Paul VI beatified him in 1965 and canonized him 12 years later.

Saint John Paul II often said that *"the Church has two lungs (East and West) and it must learn to breathe using both of them"*. Remembering saints like Sharbel helps the Church to appreciate both the diversity and unity present in the Catholic Church. Like all the saints, Sharbel points us to God and invites us to cooperate generously with God's grace, no matter what our situation in life may be.

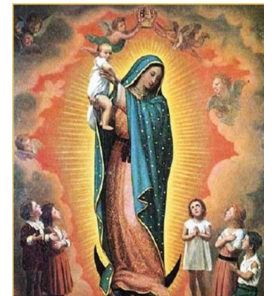
