Why Are They Veiled?



This ancient Catholic practice stems from the former liturgical calendar in which the old Gospel reading for the 5th Sunday of Lent (i.e., Passiontide) tells us on **how Jesus hid Himself** away from the Jews when they attempted to stone Him.

According to St Augustine, at this moment when Jesus "hid Himself" from the Jews, Christ in fact became invisible by virtue of His Divine nature. To help signify this mystery, crucifixes and images of Christ are veiled with purple cloth on the evening before the start of Passiontide. The same goes with the images of the saints, as it is befitting that if the glory of the Master is hidden, then His servants should not appear.

Lenten Regulations 2017

The present laws of the Church regarding fast and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

1. **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are days of fast. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.

2. **Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent** are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Canon Law states:

"On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."

fr smith's lenten reading Many people want to learn more about why we do what we do at Mass, and there is such a wealth of symbolism in every part of the Church and gesture, rite and ceremony of the Mass, that it's hard to take in. Father James Jackson's book, *Nothing Superfluous: An Explanation of the Symbolism of the Rite of St Gregory the Great* delves into the rich meaning behind so much of what we see, not only in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, but the Ordinary Form as well. 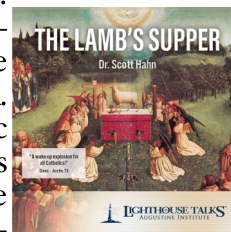
