In our own time, the vast majority of people have bought into the notion that there is no fundamental nature common to sex, marriage and family life. The teaching of the Church has thus become unintelligible. Furthermore, the radically subjectivist and individualistic bent of our culture has convinced people that, because nature is not a thing, then each of us has a right to self-determination in these areas. The only thing that should stop our self-determination, as the argument goes, is if we harm someone else's right to self-determination. It is for that reason that even the most libertine of moderns will argue that rape is inadmissible, because it infringes on someone else's freedom.

These ideas are competing with a whole host of other ideas for which will triumph in law, civil society and culture. The notion of "traditional marriage" which many cling to in today's turbulent world is in part the result of Christianity's lived witness in Western history for a prolonged period of time. It has found echoes in everything from our legal codes and wedding customs to popular music. But that notion also has grafted on to it ideas foreign to divine revelation. Ideas of romantic fancy, self-fulfillment and finding someone to "complete" them live alongside ideas of permanence, sacrifice and duty. The past 100 years has seen an incredible retreat from those aspects of marriage which are from divine revelation and the exaltation of ideas that stem from Romanticism and the Enlightenment. As this retreat has continued, law and mores have reflected this transformation.

The current legalization of same-sex marriage in the United States is a perfectly logical step in this transformation. It is also entirely at odds with how the Catholic Church has consistently viewed sex, marriage and family life in the light of Jesus Christ and His teaching. It is also difficult to square with the nature of the sexual act. It is unclear what other steps this transformation may take, as society becomes increasingly secularized.

The prevailing conception of marriage in civil society did not all of a sudden change with *Obergefell vs. Hodges*. That conception has been diverging, step by step, from the biblical and ecclesiastical conception of marriage for centuries. At the same time, the theology of marriage has not remained static. While the Church's understanding of marriage has not changed, she has developed that teaching in an admirable way.

In the early Church, Christians lived their married life in accord with the teaching of Christ, even when their pagan counterparts lived it quite differently. The notion of *contract* was essential: a man and a woman promise fidelity to each other, and created a contract to share a domestic life open to new life. Church discipline sought to uphold the sanctity and the inviolability of that contract.


Closer to our own time, Christians began to reflect on marriage as not just a contract, but also a covenant. St John Paul II's Theology of the Body focused on this aspect of Christian marriage. It has been a welcomed and necessary development in the theology of marriage, and many parishes now, including our own, form young people and couples preparing for marriage in this rich theology of married covenant life. But as the Church reflects more and more on what the covenant and contract of marriage is, she finds herself increasingly at odds with a culture which has gone in a very different direction reflecting on the same thing.


