A Good News / Bad News Story

The good news: Prince of Peace is an exceptionally active parish! Every day and nearly every evening we have multiple events going on across the campus. Christian formation classes for all ages, prayer groups, receptions, presentations, meetings, performances, recollections, dinners, sports, and of course the Celebration of the Mass – you name it, it's all happening here every day. We are blessed to have the facilities that enable a flourishing parish life.

The bad news: We don't have enough space for everything we want to do, some of our facilities are old and expensive to maintain, and most important our facilities staff is short-handed. Your facilities maintenance staff consists of two people: one full time and one part-time. Think about that for a second... Including the rectory, your parish consists of 12 structures on 35.25 acres. We have a contracted janitorial service that comes in at night to clean the buildings on a rotating basis throughout the week and a contracted landscaping service, but daily maintenance and set-up for events falls on the small maintenance staff.

Obviously the workload exceeds the capacity of our staff. That's where you come in. As parishioners, these are your buildings. If you are planning an event, ask how you can help. Plan to have a few people clean up and put away the tables and chairs afterwards. When you leave a facility, leave it as you found it – return the tables and chairs to where they were (either set up or put away), tidy up, wipe down the tables and bag the trash. Don't leave trash piled up around the containers – if it won't fit, take it to the dumpster. Anything you can do to help will allow us to keep using our buildings at the high rate we do now and ensure the group that follows yours has a clean, orderly space for their event.

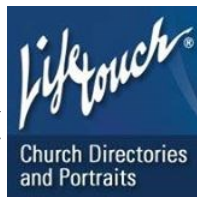
