Next Sunday at the 10a Solemn Mass, we will once again welcome new members into the Guild of Our Lady and St Gianna. It is no secret that women have always been absolutely crucial to the life and ministry of the Church. Several years ago, I felt called to establish an organization for the young women and girls of the parish whereby they could become intimately involved in the sacred liturgy. Christi Mauritz and Ashley Maddox responded to my call to get this group off the ground, and did an amazing work in doing so. You have surely seen our girls dressed in white with beautiful blue sashes trimmed in lace who lead prayers of thanksgiving after Mass and play an important part in our processions and big liturgies. You may not know that they meet on a regular basis to pray, to learn more about their Catholic faith and to receive a deep spiritual formation as young women destined for leadership in their families, workplaces and the Church.

The Guild is a relatively new concept in the life of our parish, and it has undergone its own internal transformation. I hope for younger girls to be involved as well as older ones, as mentors and models. Suzanne Gubitosa has graciously offered to lead the Guild into the next phase of its life, and I am grateful to her for her eager yes!

I chose two patrons for the Guild. Our Lady is of course the true model of all femininity. But she is also the Mother of the Eucharist. Because she is so intimately connected with Christ as His Sacrifice on Calvary, I want our young ladies to have the same intimate connection with Christ in the Eucharistic Sacrifice as she did. Just as Mary offered her life in union with that of her Son on the Cross, my hope is that our Guild members will also conform their lives to the mystery that they celebrate and participate in, at Holy Mass. I also proposed St Gianna Beretta Molla as co-patron. This remarkable young woman was a professional woman, a medical doctor, who was a devout Catholic and whose dedication to the Sacrifice of the Mass led her to sacrifice her own life for the life of her unborn child. Many of our young women will grow up to be professional working women, and my hope is that the Church can give them the same type of profound spiritual formation that their patroness had.

St Gianna's husband wrote in a letter to their children: "Your mother's life has been a perpetual act and action of faith and charity; it has been an incessant search, in each decision and in each deed, for God's will, with meditation and prayer, the holy Mass and the Eucharist. It is a continuous accomplishment of the Gospel precepts and advises, even of those which are calling you at the top of your duty, to the apostolate and to love, always, even when the sacrifice required is that of your own life." I am convinced that there are many more St Giannas out there in our pews. I encourage all our moms and girls to become actively involved in this apostolate of spiritual formation and service.

**Lenten Regulations 2016**

The present laws of the Church regarding fast and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

1. **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** are days of **fast**. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.

2. **Ash Wednesday** and all **Fridays** of Lent are also days of **abstinence**. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Canon Law states:

"On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."
