Throughout history, there have been those who have sought to separate openness to procreation, which is part of the nature of the sexual act, from the unitive aspect of that same act. Until the last century, technology was such that doing so was not always very easy. Today, though, numerous people have separated the procreative from the unitive; sex is often chosen apart from the fundamental reason for its existence.

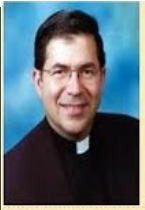
Because ideas have consequences, this means that a whole host of things are then possible: contraception, same sex activity, pornography, rape, and so on. Now, not all of the things that follow are the same, but all of them are different manifestations of sexual activity taken outside of the context of procreation. In different ways, each can be said to be not in accord with the nature of the sexual act.

Divine revelation does not prescind from the natural. It elevates it. The original unity of our first parents, the natural institution of marriage, coexisted in the Old Testament with divorce, polygamy and other phenomena that certainly do not figure into most people's idea of "traditional marriage." Christ, however, elevates the natural institution of marriage into a sacramental covenant. The Christian believer, in choosing marriage, chooses to enter into a vision of sex, marriage and family life that is both natural and supernatural. The very clear teaching of Christ is that marriage is indissoluble by any human power on earth, because it is a reflection of the eternal covenant of love God has for us.

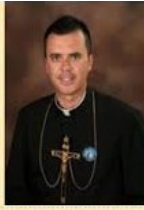
As the Church has developed that original teaching over time, she has elaborated a rich teaching on sex, marriage and family life. Even where, in some places and times, a less than positive presentation of that teaching was common, that teaching, in and of itself, has always been positive and life-affirming. But it is always anchored to this idea of nature: what does the nature of the sexual act mean, and what are its consequences? If sex is ordered to procreation, then the raising of children in the faith requires a stable union of parents under grace. *What God has joined, men must not divide.*

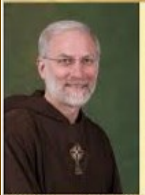

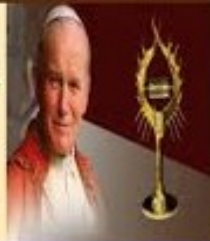

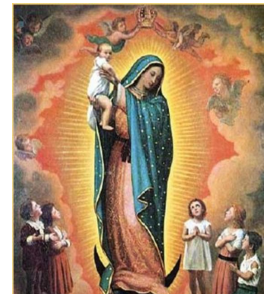
