During my vacation I had a fascinating conversation with a friend about something he called “love languages.” Intrigued to know more, I then came across a book by Gary Chapman called *The Five Love Languages*. This is not a book of theology or even spirituality, but does present an attempt to decipher why communication can break down so easily in married life. As a priest, I often see couples who find themselves in conflict. One of the things that has perplexed me in my ministry is that, even when you can get spouses really talking to each other, sometimes it seems that they are talking right past each other. Chapman’s theory is that each of us tends to express ourselves according to one of five “languages”. Once we understand the language we speak the best, and the language our partner speaks, we can discern better how to handle conflict and overcome it easier.

We live in a commitment-phobic age, and we are often too ready to give up on a relationship where we think we are not getting out of it what we need or deserve. And so, out of a desire for self-preservation, we choose what we think will be our happiness by opting out of the hard road of love and friendship. But then we find that we are not happy at all.

As Christians, we are called to image the unconditional and inexhaustible love of God. Truth be told, most of the time we come to confess our sins, we are admitting that we have not loved as Jesus has loved us. Our confession is frequently a set of variations on that theme. The Merciful Lord then bows down and dresses our wounds, and then whispers in our ear: *Go and sin no more*. He is ready and willing to help us, and so often we pray, fervently, for the grace to be that love.

But at the same time, as one priest acquaintance of mine once said, “piety is no substance for technique.” We can pray all we want, but if we are not willing to listen, to try to understand the other, and to develop the supernatural virtue of patience by taking the other seriously and ourselves, not so much, we will never be able to acquire the fluency of speaking another’s love language. When we are hurt and disappointed, or angry, we stop listening, and become deaf to the language, not of the mind or the tongue, but of the heart.

If Jesus allowed His heart to be pierced with a lance for love of us, then we should not be afraid to do the same. At the moment of His greatest weakness, He destroyed sin and death. When we surrender to the hard work of love, we can have that power. Love does truly win. Love, and do not count the cost. At the end of our lives, each of us will be judged by how we loved. If we have loved well, then all of the pain and suffering of choosing to love well will disappear before the glories of eternal joy.

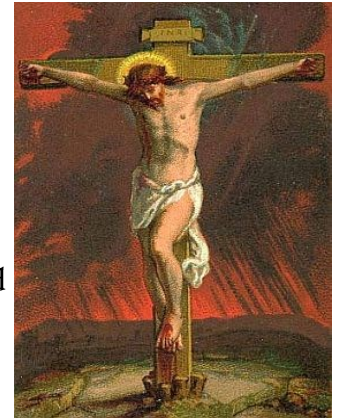
