28 february 2016 second sunday of lent (OF year C & EF)

Our sacred liturgy is supposed to be a feast for the senses. But during the penitential season of Lent, the Church adopts an austere attitude towards the outward signs of worship. Not only does she vest her ministers and altars in the royal purple of penance, but she removes entirely flowers, instrumental music, relics and other signs of festivity. You will notice we use the silver altar cross and candles and a wooden Missal stand, as well as unbleached candles. We use a special type of incense made from basil, nodding to an ancient tradition that the Empress Helena found the True Cross under a mound of basil. They are all little ways of marking the season out.

During the last two weeks of Lent, that season within a season called Passiontide, we veil the crosses and statues with purple cloth to remove them from our midst. These are all part of our Roman Lenten tradition.

The English tradition has a lot to recommend it. In the Middle Ages, it was common to have a screen with a Cross on top of it called a rood screen. A veil of unbleached linen called the hunger veil was drawn across the entire sanctuary for all of Lent, which meant that the people never actually witnessed any of the Eucharistic celebration during this season! The hunger veil, and the veils for altar and cross for the entire Lenten season, and even vestments, were made of simple unbleached linen and were embroidered with symbols of the Passion: of the crown of thorns, the nails, the sponge, the whips and cords used to bind the Savior during the Passion.

Mediterranean and Eastern Europe had some interesting customs as well. Often a prison cell would be set up in the church, with a statue of Our Lord in the crown of thorns and his robe the soldiers mocked him with, his hands tied. Or a funeral pyre with a statue of the dead Jesus that was taken around in procession during Holy Week.

Our own Roman tradition is much more austere, and less designed to elicit an emotional response. The first four weeks of Lent are more about our own spiritual combat and struggle in the desert of mortification, and the last two weeks focus more intensely on the events of the Sacred Passion.

While I personally appreciate the Roman approach, I can see that in our own age of indifference to suffering and injustice, an emotional call to meditate on the pains of the Savior can be a fierce antidote to the self-absorption of our world. I remember one of the most powerful things in my life was when my spiritual director in college fashioned some of the instruments of the passion and used them on a cardbox box to get us to really get a sense of what it was like for Jesus to suffer as he did for us. As a young man, every Lent I would read Pierre Barbet's medical account of the Passion in *A Doctor at Calvary* and invariably be moved to tears.

Of course, the reason for meditation on the Passion is not for us to develop a gloomy obsession with pain and death. It should lead us to a profound gratefulness for the love with which Our Lord offered Himself so completely for us. Christ conquered death, and has risen triumphantly, so that we can too. But for us to be disciples of Christ, we must conform ourselves in every way to Him, and that means taking up the Cross. Not dragging it behind us, but embracing it for love.

Lenten Regulations 2016

The present laws of the Church regarding fast and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

- I.Good Friday is a day of fast. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.
- 2. All Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Cannon Law states:

"On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."
