

Dear Friends in Christ,

There are always seems to be one tragedy after another in the news. And, whenever it happens, you always have somebody who pipes up, "Why can't we all just get along?" We all have a sense that we are meant to be one. But, what does that unity look like? And, how does it respect legitimate diversity? November is, in one sense, a month which challenges us, as Christians, to think about what it means to be one. I mean, we all share one human nature. There's this great big beautiful sea of humanity out there. But, why do we seem like we mess it up so much? When Jesus became one of us, He united our humanity to His divinity. In Jesus, the many become one without losing their particularity, any more than the Unity of God is compromised by the Trinity of persons.

By baptism, we become part of this one Body of redeemed humanity in Christ. We celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, the feast of the Church Militant on earth made up of the soldiers of Christ who have been signed, sealed and delivered to fight, not with weapons of mass destruction, but love. Inasmuch as we belong fully to the one communion of the Church established by Christ, that unity in faith, morals and sacramental life makes us ever more one. It is only when we separate from that unity, by the grave sins of heresy, schism and apostasy, that we see that unity frayed. And, that causes conflict, suffering and disunity.

On I November, the Church celebrates the Feast of All Saints. We remember, not only the saints who have been recognized as such by a formal process whose memorials decorate the calendar throughout the year, but all of those soldiers of Christ who fought the good fight, finished the race and are crowned with an imperishable crown in heaven to co-reign with the Risen Lord forever. It is only when we give up the fight and give into evil, that we lose heaven and merit the absence of God, which is the hell that we choose and that God does not want for us. The unity of the sempiternal chorus of praise in heaven contrasts with the disordered cacophony of the damned.

The day after, the Church commemorates All Souls who are in need of that final purification from the wounds left behind by sin through purgatory before they are admitted to the celestial court of the Great King. The Church Suffering explates those sins and heals the many divisions in our hearts to become one. But think of how, the souls in purgatory cannot help themselves at all. They are entirely dependent on the Mercy of God to transform them into the best version of themselves. But God allows us, and asks us to cooperate in that transformation by praying and offering sacrifices for them, and that incredible spiritual work of mercy, a fruit of living faith, is applied to these souls. When we forget the souls in purgatory, our beloved dead, charity in our own hearts lessens. The many divisions in our souls continue on, because we are too worried by the things of this earth to cooperate with God's work of making the hearts of all men one.

Purgatory was one of those things which gripped the imagination of simple people and piqued the creativity of speculative theologians for centuries. Our own age is deeply skeptical of what we cannot see, and even the hint of superstition makes us wary of emotional abuse and religious manipulation (and justly so). But, the reality is that our true unity is found in Christ, and Christ's Body, the Church, is Militant on earth, Suffering in purgatory and Triumphant in heaven. We are surrounded by a cloud of witnesses: angels, saints and souls awaiting their final transfiguration. Don't let your heart focus too much on this world. You're missing out on so much if you do!






