In order to qualify for parishioner discount for the school, families must observe the following

You must be a registered, active, and contributing member of Prince of Peace Catholic Church.

You must attend Sunday Mass 75% of the time at Prince of Peace with your family, using your envelope to help us track your attendance.

You must contribute financially to the parish within your means either by using offertory envelopes or through electronic funds transfer. While there is no minimum contribution at Prince of Peace, other local parishes require contributions of \$25 to \$40 per week to receive the Parishioner Rate.

You must perform volunteer service at the parish or school.

Twice a year, we analyze the data to determine whether or not families who are receiving parishioner rate should continue to do so. On our last review, 123 families were receiving the parishioner rate. We determined according to the above objective criteria that 28 families were fulfilling the conditions to receive the parishioner rate, according to a form they signed at registration. 32 received warning letters that they were in danger of not receiving the rate, because their Mass attendance was in the 67-75% range. And 63 families received a letter that they were not fulfilling the conditions for the parishioner rate and that they would begin to be charged according to the nonparishioner rate.

Prince of Peace Catholic School is the principal apostolate of Prince of Peace Catholic Church. Its mission is to form Christian disciples for the next generation. Attendance at Sunday Mass and supporting the work of both church and school is absolutely indispensable in order for both church and school to fulfill the mission given to it by God.

Sometimes families choose Catholic education but they do not want to fulfill the obligations they took at their children's baptism to raise them in the faith. We are disappointed and sad when this happens. The school remains open to them, but it is not fair to those who do give of their time, talent and treasure to our parish family, to subsidize those who do not but claim to do so. We owe it in justice to those who support the school as part of the mission of this parish that they not have their contributions to fund those who claim to be fulfilling requirements to receive the rate of a parishioner but are not. We also owe it in justice to the families who sacrifice for their children's education and the life of their parish that they not carry the freight of those who are not doing what they do every week as part of their faith.

As Catholics, we are bound under pain of mortal sin to attend Mass every Sunday and Holy Day unless legitimately impeded by necessary work, illness or the demands of charity. This obligation is imposed on us by God in His Commandment: *make the Sabbath Day holy.* It is also a Commandment of the Church in the Catechism: *support the work of the Church.* When families stop coming to Mass or stop supporting their parish, their soul is endangered, their Catholic identity suffers and the life of a parish and school community suffers. All over the country Catholic schools are closing because we have let people slide into sinful patterns that have eroded the faith.

This New Year it is time to proclaim a goal at Prince of Peace. 100% of our parish and school families coming to Mass, supporting the parish sacrificially.
