From our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends,

For the next few weeks I wanted to introduce you to the lives of some of my mentors, who have influenced much of how I approach my pastoral ministry here at Prince of Peace. The first was Adrian Fortescue (1874-1923), an English priest. This incredible man held doctorates in moral theology, dogma, canon law, scripture and biblical languages. He spoke numerous living and dead languages fluently, and traveled widely throughout the Middle East at a time in which for a Brit to do was an adventure indeed. Even though he was inclined to scholarly pursuits, and academia was his natural environment, he was called to parish ministry.



Father Fortescue was assigned to a new parish called St Hugh in Letchworth, a mining village. He had to build the parish, and its church, from the ground up. But his incredible knowledge of scripture, liturgy, music and art made it a unique parish. In an age in which many English Catholics were lucky to have a quickly said Mass by a priest occasionally, Fortescue set about to make sure that his parishioners were able to participate in daily Masses celebrated with great care. He also taught Gregorian chant and Latin to his parishioners. It was probably the only place in the world where miners and their children brought their chant books to Mass with them and sang High Mass and Vespers every Sunday and feast day.

He is best known for a book called *Ceremonies of the Roman Rite Described*. Until then, priests in the English speaking world had to deal with badly translated Italian books to learn how to pray the Mass. Fortescue produced a book that has remained a classic, and even drew the diagrams for the book. But he did so, not because he was actually all that interested in ritual minutiae. In fact, he had very little patience for sacristy rats who obsessed over such thing. He wrote the book to get money for his parishioners, many of whom were poor, so he could help them. Even though today his book is very well known among traditionalist Catholics, Fortescue himself was open to the theological and intellectual currents of his day. For him, the priest's job was to lead the people in authentic living prayer through the Church's sacred rites, and to teach them not only to appreciate the treasures of the Church's patrimony, but to be open to new ideas that were not inconsistent with them.

Fortescue was only 49 when he died, but he left behind an incredible monument to Catholicism in England, providing a unique but rich parish liturgical and spiritual life that was free from sentimentalism and rigidity, and open to authentic Christian witness open to things ever ancient and ever new.

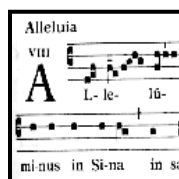

100th anniversary of our lady of fatima



To celebrate the 100 year anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima, all are encouraged to participate with our parish in the following:

1. **PRAY** - A Novena to Our Lady of Fatima, 5-13 May.

2. **1st SATURDAY MASS** - Per Our Lady of Fatima's request, participate in the celebration of Mass on 5 **consecutive** 1st Saturdays of a month.

3. **PLENARY INDULGENCE** - Pope Francis has decided to grant a plenary indulgence to the pious faithful who visit with devotion a statue of Our Lady of Fatima solemnly exposed for public veneration during the days of the anniversary of the apparitions, the 13th of each month from May to October (2017), and there devoutly participate in some celebration or prayer in honor of the Virgin Mary.

To obtain the plenary indulgence, the faithful must also fulfill the ordinary conditions: go to Confession and Communion, be interiorly detached from sin, and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, as well as pray an Our Father, recite the Creed and invoke Our Lady of Fatima (i.e. ask for her help and intercession).

POP will honor Our Lady of Fatima in the Adoration Chapel each of these days, offering you the opportunity for this indulgence.

4. **CONSECRATION** - Participate in our parish 33-day Consecration to Jesus through Mary beginning September 4, concluding on 7 October, Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary and the 1st Saturday of October. (stay tuned for more information).

5. **EUCCHARISTIC HOLY HOUR** - Participate in a worldwide Holy Hour (children are encouraged to participate with adults) before the Blessed Sacrament at Prince of Peace on the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, 7 October (stay tuned for more information).
