A year from now the ecclesial communities founded as a result of the Protestant Reformation will celebrate the 500th anniversary of the day on which Martin Luther is said (more by legend than fact) to have posted 95 theses against the Church of Rome on the church door at Wittenberg. In fact, Lutheran churches all over the world have commemorated this event on the last Sunday of October since 1717.

As Catholics, obviously, we cannot celebrate in any form the fact that as a result of Luther's action, Christians have been divided from one another ever since. We can never celebrate any disunity within the Body of Christ and the severance of souls from the fullness of truth, which alone is found in the Catholic Church. Far from being a day of joy for us, it should be one of penance and prayer for unity among Christians.

The ecumenical movement of the last century has done wonders in getting Catholics and Protestants to join together in fellowship and in those forms of prayer which do not violate the unity of our faith. Theological dialogue has led to some significant documents of agreement where discord reigned before. And that is all to the good.

At the same time though, as Catholic Christians we must avoid both triumphalism and proselytism on the one hand (being arrogant and high handed about our faith) and indifference on the other (the attitude that, as long as you're Christian, it really doesn't matter what Church you belong to.) Both dangers are ruinous to the integral proclamation of the truth of the faith. But even more importantly, we must pray and work towards Christian unity.

It is important that we understand our separated brothers and sisters, to understand the history and theology of why they remain outside the fold, but it is also important to realize that they are indeed brothers and sisters. The vast majority of non-Catholic Christians today are not outside the Catholic Church because of any hatred against the Church; they are not responsible for the divisions of the 16th century. We, however, are responsible to learn as much about our Catholic faith as possible, and to explain and defend it as best we can.

During this sad 500th anniversary of events that split Christendom apart, and which led to religious wars, the Enlightenment and the rise of secularism which is now threatening all forms of Christian expression, let us resolve to pray for and work towards unity, to fulfill the prayer of Jesus, that all would be one.

all souls day-wednesday, 2 November

The entire month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory; those who have died “in God’s grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvations; but after death undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of Heaven” (CCC 1030, Purgatory).

The Church teaches us that it is an act of charity to pray for our deceased brothers and sisters, that God may forgive them their sins and welcome them into the fullness of His Presence. We celebrate Holy Mass for all who have died and are on pilgrimage towards Christ. A plenary indulgence which is applicable only to the Holy Souls in Purgatory is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery on All Souls Day and recite the Lord’s Prayer and Creed. More information will be in the All Souls packet that was in the bulletin on 23 October.

There will be a candle placed on St Joseph’s Altar for each parishioner who has died since All Souls Day last year. After the month of November, family members are asked to pick up the candle from the Parish Office.


