Update on my dad: My father left rehab a month after the stroke, and the Bishop has given me permission to move him in at home. Because of the dementia, which has been made worse by the stroke, he cannot remain at home by himself. After a lot of research and help with Browning Consultants, who specialize in crafting long term geriatric care plans, we have come up with a plan. We want dad to be in a home environment as long as possible, and I am trying to balance my duty to him as his only child and primary caregiver, as well as my duty to the parish. During the day he will be at the Haven at Chanticleer, an adult day care program; and in the mornings and evenings we are piecing together a plan with volunteers and homecare assistants. We are still trying to keep him as independent as possible and not sell assets until we have to. So I am looking at something in the neighborhood of \$50,000 a year to pay for his care in this arrangement.

At some point, barring the miracle for which I am praying, he will have to go into assisted living. Both the present arrangement and assisted living are self-pay situations. There are some organizations that provide some support, and we are looking into those. At the same time, we are looking at needing a reserve of almost \$100,000 for when he no longer recognizes who I am and the dementia progresses to a point that I cannot take care of him at home or assisted living and he needs skilled nursing care. During this process, I discovered that my dad compromised his own financial security to fund my education, all so that I could serve God and the Church. Pretty amazing for a good Baptist boy, and it makes me even more grateful for the sacrifices of a loving father.

I have often talked about the Church's teaching on the dignity of life. I never realized that one day I would be called to witness to that in such a personal and radical way. This has been the hardest thing I have ever had to do in my life, but I have seen over and over how God has used us to touch so many. It is an honor to serve my father in this way, even though I have to confess the sleepless nights and tears have been plenty.

I am very proud of how our parish has rallied around my dad and I with love and support. Maria Rauch and Stephanie Lasitter have done a tremendous job in communicating with those who have offered their time, talent and treasure for us. I may in the future look into doing a GoFundMe campaign to help with the expenses, as I try to be efficient about them. I thank you for your patience during this time of crisis. We are settling into a "new normal", but, as anyone who has been a caregiver knows, life is always changing.

For now, it is a pleasure to have Dad in the rectory, and to be able to pray with him in our chapel and eat and spend time with him every day, something that I was unable to do as often as I would have liked, or should have, before. The parish is providing a house for him at this time, but everything else I am providing from his and my resources. I think it important for you to know what is going on.

In the meantime, as your pastor, I urge everyone to plan as much as possible for a future that could change from one day to the next with a diagnosis of dementia. It is the only one of the top 10 diseases that cannot be prevented, cured or slowed. By 2025, the number of people age 65 and older with Alzheimer's disease is estimated to reach 7.1 million - a 40 percent increase from the 5.1 million age 65 and older affected in 2015. Please make plans now!

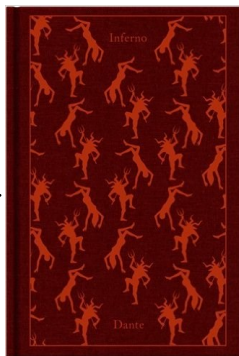
