Indeed, the successor of Peter, mandated by the Lord Jesus to guarantee the unity of the episcopate and to preside over and safeguard the universal communion of all the Churches, could not fail to make available the means necessary to bring this holy desire to realization."

-Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI Anglicanorum Coetibus

The history that His Holiness Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI refers to in the opening statement of the Apostolic Constitution *Anglicanorum Coetibus* has been a complex period of time where different groups within the Anglican Communion, and with varying intensity, have petitioned and longingly sought to be once again reunited with the Holy See of Peter. By the grace of God I have had the fortunate opportunity to have been baptized and raised in the Anglican tradition, but as I continued to grow and develop in my faith I experienced definite aspects of the Protestant heritage of Anglicanism that gave me pause and forced me to ask very serious questions about my faith.

In the Anglican Church I was blessed to have been introduced to the beauty of the liturgy, where all Christians are called to "worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness." (Ps. 96:9) At the Anglican seminary where I was trained, Nashotah House Theological Seminary, I experienced High Church theology, discipline, and the ideals of the Oxford Movement set in the spirituality of a Benedictine way of life. That season of my life gave me the opportunity to study, work, and pray the theological Seminary.

ology of our faith in an orthodox and classically catholic way.

One such part of Anglican history that helped me to understand and appreciate my Catholic faith and identity was the Oxford Movement. This movement in Anglican history was initiated by a small group of Oxford trained men that captured the imaginations of many High Church Anglicans in the early 19th century. This small group of Anglican Divines began to write a series of tracts, which gave them the name Tractarians, that attempted to correct an increasingly Protestant emphasis in the Church of England; by both returning to the Church Fathers and restoring certain aspects of medieval theology and piety. This historical movement intentionally walked a tight rope between the Protestant approach of a hyper-emphasis on the primacy of Scripture and appropriate Catholic appeals to the richness of tradition.

The constant struggle that these men experienced proved to be a very isolating existence, where they neither felt completely home with their more Protestant fellow clergymen or within the Catholic Church. Blessed John Cardinal Henry Newman especially felt this restlessness. To this day many Anglicans who share the same High Church theology as the Tractarians can feel a similar sense of isolation. However, because of the graciousness of our Pastor and his ecumenical sensitivity has provided a way for Anglicans, like Chris Bourne and myself, to be welcomed into the beauty and

fullness of the Catholic faith.

This graciousness that Pope Benedict XVI has afforded the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church truly is a momentous event in the reparation of Christian unity based on true ecumenical principles. In our increasingly secular age *Anglicanorum Coetibus* is an invaluable opportunity to evangelize and even re-catechize already baptized Christians into the fullness of the Catholic faith based on a return to Scripture, the Church Fathers, Magisterium of the Church, and reason. We have an opportunity once again rethink how we categorize our sense of self-identity and challenge historical denominational barriers.

Q. If I have committed a mortal sin, and can't get to confession, can't I just say an Act of Contrition and then go to Communion anyway?

A. The clear teaching of the Catholic Church was defined at the Council of Trent that this is not possible, except where there is a emergency in which there is no possible way to go to confession, and one possesses perfect contrition for one's sins:

canon 11: If anyone says that faith alone is sufficient preparation for receiving the sacrament of the most Holy discovery of all time. Eucharist, let him be anathema. And, lest so great a sacrament be received unworthily and hence unto death and condemnation, this Holy Council determines and decrees that those whose conscience is burdened with mortal sin, no matter how contrite they may think they are, first must necessarily make a sacramental confession if a confessor is available. If anyone presumes to teach or preach or obstinately maintain or defend in public disputation the opposite of this, he shall by the very fact be excommunicated.


