

Dear Friends in Christ,

Harvard professor Arthur Schlesinger, Jr pointed out in his essay The Significance of Jacksonian Democracy that anti-Catholic prejudice is "the deepest bias in the history of the American people." Even though Catholics are the largest single religious group in the country, and many Catholics have struggled to prove their loyalty to both God and country, both yesterday and today we can feel "strangers in a strange land." The American Catholic experience is bound up with the history of immigration, as the vast majority of Catholics arrived in the country through waves of immigration. Xenophobic and racist hatred against Irish, Italian, German, and Africans, just to name a few, was often caught up with virulently anti-Catholic attitudes.

In the 19th century, nativist "Know Nothings" even had a political party whose platform was the eradication of "papists" from this country. Religious tolerance was extended to every conceivable form of Christianity except for Catholicism. Even where civil rights were not denied, the cultural pressure against Catholics was great. It was one of the many reasons why Catholics established an alternative system of schools, because public schools in the United States frequently formed children in those nativist bigoted attitudes. The history of England, with its story of Catholic persecution, formed the American landscape.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen once commented, "There's not one person who hates the Catholic Church but there are millions who hate what they think the Catholic Church is." Ignorance is not bliss, and is the breeding ground for hatred. In our own Greenville area, Catholics were few and far between until just a few years ago. We now have the highest Catholic population in South Carolina. Catholics are found in visible positions in our community. But that doesn't mean prejudice has gone away. In 1991, when I became a Catholic, my parents had a real fear that the Ku Klux Klan would burn a cross on the front lawn or harm our family. While today, I think the chances of the KKK harming us is slim, that doesn't mean those attitudes have disappeared.



feast of the transfiguration of the lord

6 August: Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. The Transfiguration is one of the major events in the earthly life of Jesus. The gospels tell the story of Jesus bringing Peter, James and John up to the top of a high mountain to pray (tradition holds that it was Mount Tabor). While he was praying, Jesus' appearance changed and his clothing became dazzling white: "His face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light" (Mt 17:2). Next, Moses and Elijah appeared in glory and spoke with Jesus of things that were to come. The disciples were dumbfounded. Peter offered to put up tents for Jesus and his friends. Although they had been with Jesus for three years, the disciples still did not really understand who He is. Then, a cloud overshadowed them. They became frightened and heard a voice from Heaven saying: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." (Mt 17:5). After Moses and Elijah disappeared, Jesus instructed the disciples not to tell anyhow about this "until the Son of man has been raised from the dead" (Mt 17:9). This event, called the Transfiguration, is quite significant in the Christian faith. Aquinas called it the "greatest miracle" because it revealed the divinity of Christ before his passion and death.

Some ways to celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration at home:

- Pray a decade of the Luminous mysteries together as a family—the Transfiguration, of course!
- In the Scriptures, mountains are often portrayed as sacred places where humans meet God. (Think of Moses on Mt. Sinai and Elijah on Mt. Horeb.) If you can, take a mountain hike today and spend some time in quiet prayer and reflection.
- Celebrate this feast day with all things WHITE! Wear white clothing; set the dinner table with a white tablecloth; cook and eat lots of white foods to recall how Jesus' face "shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light" (Mt. 17:2).
 - Ideas: egg white omelets and biscuits for breakfast; fettuccine alfredo or white fish with mashed potatoes or rice for dinner. Dessert could be angel food cake with vanilla ice cream or homemade whipped cream. (Heavy cream is 'transformed' when you whip it up with a bit of sugar. This is a fun hands-on activity to do with your children!) OR, simply 'transform' leftover food into a new dinner to celebrate this transformative feast day.
- With tradition holding that the Pope presses ripe grapes into the chalice at Mass or uses new wine on this feast, don't forget to enjoy a bottle of sparkling grape juice or red wine at supper tonight! (The symbolism here is the transformation: fruit develops from bud, to flower, to ripened fruit which is a natural transfiguration. Then, the grapes continue to be transformed from fruit, to juice, to wine, and then sacramentally, to the Blood of Christ received in the Eucharist.)

parish events

- Fr Smith highly encourages postponing the start of regular events until at least mid-September
- Every ministry who wishes to have an event must submit an email to Fr Smith & Phil Head (cc: Maria Rauch) the plan they have to clean and sanitize every space used by them before anyone goes home, including the names and contact numbers of the volunteers who will make this happen. That communication must be received before any single event is put on the calendar.
- Wearing masks and social distancing is encouraged at every event. If Fr Smith & Phil Head are not convinced this has been followed, we reserve the right to shut down an event even in the middle of it.
- Ministry events should be communicated 3 weeks prior to the event date. Those ministry events happening online (or for those wishing to have an event hosted online via Zoom by the parish) should contact Kylee Heap. We highly encourage online events to reach parishioners who are not yet returning to Mass.
- Guidelines are subject to change!




