Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Feast of All Saints reminds us that this world is not our true home. The vision that the Apostle John has of the multitude in paradise, washed in the blood of the Lamb, shouting triumphantly in glory, is a message of hope that, no matter what we go through on this earth, he who perseveres to the end will be saved. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* has some powerful paragraphs which discuss the Second Coming of Christ for which we pray every time we say, *Thy Kingdom come*. It also reminds us of the struggle that believers will go through as the spirit of Anti-Christ challenges them at every turn:

673: Since the Ascension Christ's coming in glory has been imminent, even though "it is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority." This eschatological coming could be accomplished at any moment, even if both it and the final trial that will precede it are "delayed."

675: Before Christ's second coming the Church must pass through a final trial that will shake the faith of many believers. The persecution that accompanies her pilgrimage on earth will unveil the "mystery of iniquity" in the form of a religious deception offering men an apparent solution to their problems at the price of apostasy from the truth. The supreme religious deception is that of the Antichrist, a pseudo-messianism by which man glorifies himself in place of God and of his Messiah come in the flesh.

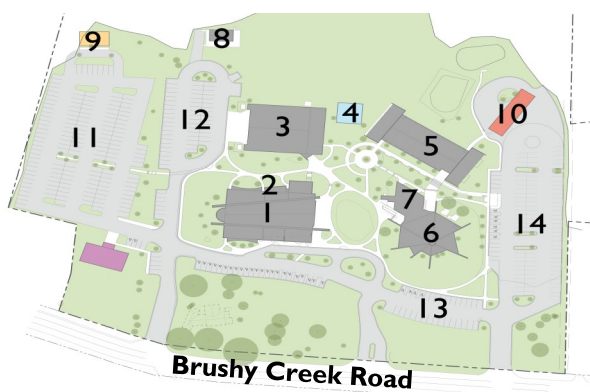
676: The Antichrist's deception already begins to take shape in the world every time the claim is made to realize within history that messianic hope which can only be realized beyond history through the eschatological judgment. The Church has rejected even modified forms of this falsification of the kingdom to come under the name of millenarianism, especially the "intrinsically perverse" political form of a secular messianism.

677: The Church will enter the glory of the kingdom only through this final Passover, when she will follow her Lord in his death and Resurrection. The kingdom will be fulfilled, then, not by a historic triumph of the Church through a progressive ascendancy, but only by God's victory over the final unleashing of evil, which will cause his Bride to come down from heaven. God's triumph over the revolt of evil will take the form of the Last Judgment after the final cosmic upheaval of this passing world.

Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no help. When his breath departs, he returns to the earth, on that very day his plans perish. Psalm 146.3-4 warns us that we are unwise to view everything and everyone through the lens of this-worldly politics. Only Jesus saves. If we want peace, we must work for justice, but that peace is a gift that comes from God as a result of our obedience in faith to the divinely revealed Word of Truth. As long as we live in this world, we must battle with powers and principalities, and work in and through structures, institutions and organizations that are imperfect. We have a duty to inform our choices with the light of the Gospel, and use our freedom, not for license, but for the common good. That freedom comes with responsibility, and has been bought at the price of those who have sacrificed for it and continue to do so.

Masses to pray for the souls of the just who are being prepared for the glorious vision of God will be on Monday, 2 November:

- 7a OF, 8.30a OF, 12p Latin EF, 7p Latin EF

A candle will be placed on the altar of St Joseph in honor of all those who have died from our parish in the past year.

Each year, a vase of white roses for all miscarried babies and a single red rose for the millions of aborted babies is placed on the altar of St Joseph.

Add a copy of a photo of your loved one to the Board of Remembrance at the St Joseph Altar. Try to refrain from large size or group photos due to space limitations.

Names will be read of those who died since All Souls' Day 2019 (2 November 2019) so they can be read aloud before the 7p Mass. Call the parish office to include your relative. If a funeral was at POP, no call is needed.

All registered active households receive 2 envelopes for All Souls' Day. One is for the offertory on All Souls Day and the other is to write on the front the names of your beloved deceased. Complete and return that envelope in any collection during the month of October. Those names will be placed on the altar of remembrance throughout the month of November.

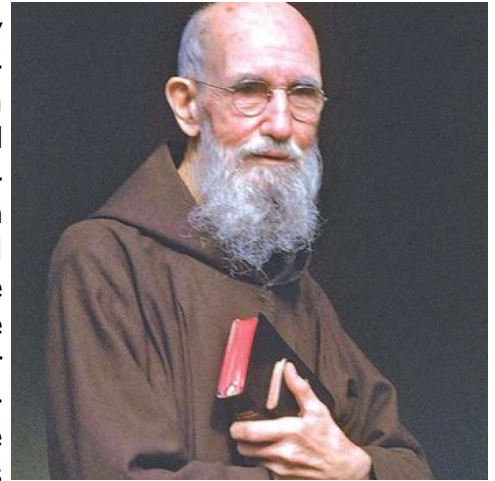

feast of blessed solanus casey

3 November: Blessed Solanus Casey. Born Bernard Francis Casey to Irish immigrants in 1870, he first considered the priesthood after witnessing a brutal murder as a young man. In seminary, he struggled with studies and mastering languages. Because of his poor grades, Blessed Solanus was dismissed. He was sent to a Capuchin Franciscan community. Blessed Solanus was hesitant but heard the Blessed Mother tell him to “go to Detroit” and so he did. He donned the Franciscan habit and chose the name Solanus, after a 17th-century missionary. Franciscan life was a good fit, but academic difficulties caused his superiors to decide he would remain a “simplex priest” (meaning he could not preach or hear confessions). Fr. Solanus was assigned to be the monastery’s porter: the main link from the friars to the outside world. He soon became renowned as “the doorkeeper” who gave gentle counsel and miraculous intercession. He would listen to anyone at any time, day or night. People would line up for blocks just to have a moment with him. He told them to “thank God ahead of time.” One story of his miraculous intercession is told about a friar who came to see Solanus on his way to have emergency dental work done. Fr. Solanus blessed him and told him to trust God. While the friar was at the dentist, a lady who came to visit the monastery brought Fr. Solanus two ice cream cones. Too busy to eat them, Fr. Solanus shoved the cones into his desk drawer, much to the dismay of his secretary. After more than half an hour, the friar returned from the dentist, his tooth found miraculously healthy. He went to thank Father Solanus, who pulled out perfectly frozen ice cream cones from his drawer on the hot summer day, which he offered to the friar to celebrate. Fr. Solanus was also known for quirky habits such as playing his harmonica to the monastery bees; for singing in a loud squeaky voice as he played his violin; and for eating his breakfast all mixed together as a penance-- cereal, prune juice, coffee, and milk in the same bowl. Blessed Solanus’ last years were spent suffering severe pain but he never complained. He died on July 31, 1957, and tens of thousands lined up to view his body before burial. Thousands more have sought his miraculous intercession. Blessed Solanus was beatified in 2017. November 3 and July 30 are both dates associated with his feast.



Ideas for celebrating this feast day at home:

- Enjoy ice cream cones today! For a crazy menu twist, try mixing up all your breakfast foods and drinks in the same bowl, like Blessed Solanus did, as a penance.
- Do something for the poor. Fr. Solanus is known for starting the Capuchin Soup Kitchen, which to this day cares for Detroit’s poor. Our own parish ministry, St. Vincent de Paul, is teaming up with the Knights of Columbus to provide turkey dinners and warm coats to those in need this holiday season. 2 November: the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls): The Catholic Church has always offered prayers and masses for the dead and considers it a spiritual work of mercy. The Holy Souls in Purgatory are the souls of those who have died in the love of Christ but who must yet pass through a period of final purgation, or spiritual cleansing of their sins, before entering the perfection of heaven. They are the “Faithful Departed” and are an active part of the mystical body of Christ known as the “Church Suffering.” Because of their pains we must pray and make sacrifices for them, especially for those we have known and loved, so that they will enter heaven more speedily. We are reminded by the Church on this special day to always pray for those who have gone before us. “May the souls of the faithful departed,

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This has been a difficult year. We are seven months into a pandemic and are preparing for elections in our country — all this, during one of the toughest times in our nation's history. However, we must not tire in our call to faithfully participate in civic life.

What is important for all of us to recognize, especially as Christians, is that we are not Republicans nor are we Democrats. We are Catholics first and foremost. We are one family in faith, and we have a responsibility to our nation and to our communities to seek the common good of all people. Our responsibility includes voting based on an informed conscience and our moral beliefs. We must research the issues and avoid any tendency towards favoring particular personalities or our own political bias. We must seek answers to sincere matters of policy, and find the truth buried in the daily assault of political rhetoric from every direction.

A year ago, my brother bishops and I issued a statement about the 2020 election. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops agreed that abortion was to remain the preeminent moral issue facing our nation. The word “preeminent” was a deliberate choice meant to indicate urgency as we perform our civic duty this November. While the Catholic Church has clear teaching on many important issues, we cannot advocate for important social changes if our nation does not have justice or peace for those in the womb.

I urge you, please do not stand idle. Engage in proper research, find out what the candidates stand for, and then vote. Each of us must take this very seriously and cast a ballot. A well-formed conscience in light of the Church's teaching means we vote not from insecurity or selfishness, but for love of our God, love of our nation, and love for the most vulnerable.

God bless you and your families. Let us pray for our nation and seek the intercession of the patroness of South Carolina, Our Lady of Joyful Hope.
