

Dear Friends in Christ:

I have many pet peeves, as you all well know, since I have never had a poker face. One of the things I find the most annoying is when people are close-minded. I think that you can hold on to your own identity and still be open to what new people and new experiences can teach us. You can hold your ground on what you believe without compromise and still appreciate the seeds of truth, goodness and beauty which are there in others.

When I was in Turkey, I had the great grace to meet people who were living their Christian faith in the midst of an environment which alternated between being openly hostile to dismissive. But I also met a number of baptized Catholics who had lapsed into atheism or non-practicing status. I met committed secularists who fear that any public manifestation of religion can lead to sectarian violence and obscurantism. I met faithful Muslims who are horrified by terrorism and discriminatory treatment of Christians and women. And I also met fundamentalists Muslims for whom all they needed to know was that I was a *gavur*, an infidel who had defiled the true revelation of God by associating other people or things (Jesus' divinity, for example) with the one true God.

In all of those encounters, I tried in my poor way to listen, to challenge, to witness and to learn. I have found that we all have much more common ground than we think, and that as we share our basic humanity, it can open us up to paths where an authentic dialogue can bring us all to the source of Truth. It is that journey that defuses anger, fear and violence. When I was there, the State Department issued a warning that there were credible allegations that Americans would be subject to terrorist attacks and kidnapping. Without a lot of data, I had to choose whether or not I would live in fear and retreat into suspicion or hatred, or continue on my path to absorb the culture in which I was living and be the invisible salt of that earth. What did prudence mean in that situation, and would I have the courage to make sacrifices when I needed to do so. I can tell you one thing, it certainly brought me to my knees in prayer. And that brought a lot of peace.

Learning new languages, traveling and meeting new people: it's not everyone's thing. I'm an extravert. I get energized by what makes some people exhausted. But that openness to the other, when we engage it from a place where we are solid in our own self and identity, can be a source of tremendous beauty and strength in our lives. I chose to immerse myself in this world which is so different than mine not because I have seen my faith and sense of self weakened. On the contrary, it has deepened my spiritual awareness and given me a stronger sense of self in this big wide world.

Don't be afraid to learn new things and get out of your comfort space. Yes, it could all go terribly wrong. I could have actually gotten myself into a situation which I could never have dreamed of at home. But it could also go wonderfully right. I learned a lot about Islam, Turkey and Turkish and the Turks, and a lot about what it means to be a misunderstood minority. In its own way, it has made me a better Christian, a more appreciative American, and more attuned to how creative being along the few and far between can make us. Will I go back? *Inshallah*, as God wills, as they say in Turkish.



feast of st nicholas

6 December: Feast of St Nicholas. St Nicholas is the patron of children, the hungry, brides and scholars! He was born in the year 270 and grew up on the coast of what is now Turkey with his wealthy Greek parents. He became bishop in Myra and died there on December 6, 343. He was also known as "Nikaolaos of Myra" and "boy bishop", because he became a bishop at the young age of 30. He was known for being incredibly generous, especially to children. In the year 800, he was officially recognized as a Saint. In France in the 1200s, Catholics began celebrating Bishop Nicholas Day on December 6. Throughout the years, Saint Nicholas became more well-known and Dutch immigrants brought their traditions to America. They added their pronunciation of his name — Sinter Klass. This began to lead the way to the tradition of gifts being brought in the night by the name of Santa Claus on Christmas Eve.





Traditions: The most popular way to celebrate St. Nicholas Day is to put shoes out for St. Nicholas to leave small treats and gifts in. This tradition is done

in remembrance of how St. Nicholas himself would leave gifts for the poor outside their windows or doors at night. Children love this tradition! They put their shoes out the night before St. Nicholas Day. Shoes can be placed outside a door or by the fireplace. When they awake, it is a delight to find that St. Nicholas has left special surprises in their shoes!

St. Nicholas Day shoe gift ideas:

- Chocolate gold coins (to represent the gold coins St. Nicholas left for 3 poor daughters)
- Candy canes, Life Savers, or other little candies
- Small toys or trinkets
- Ginger or gingerbread cookies
- Clothing or new shoes (to represent how St. Nicholas gave clothing to the poor)
- A Christmas ornament
- Clementines (because they also represent the gold St. Nick gave away)
- Religious items (medals, holy cards, rosaries, saints books or videos, saints peg dolls, etc)

Some fun St. Nicholas feast day activities for children include coloring pages or printable ornaments:

- Check out these from Catholic Icing
- Here is an idea for making a St. Nicholas miter
- Another neat tradition is the blessing of candy canes. The candy cane shape reminds us of St. Nicholas' crozier (bishop's staff). On St. Nicholas day, you may purchase candy canes and say this blessing
- Most importantly, be sure to pray together and ask St. Nicholas to intercede for you and your family.

God our Father, we pray that through the intercession of St. Nicholas, you will protect our children. Keep them safe from harm and help them grow and become worthy in your sight. Give them strength to keep their Faith in You; and to keep alive their joy in your creation. Through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

God of joy and cheer, we thank you for your servant, the good bishop Nicholas. In loving the poor, he showed us your kindness; in caring for your children, he revealed your love. Make us thoughtful without need of reward so that we, too, may be good followers of Jesus.
