

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

When King Louis XVI was brutally murdered in 1793, the French Revolution inaugurated a process of change by which the monarchies of Europe and the societies they governed ceased to exist entirely by the end of World War I in 1918. The Church had never gotten alone perfectly with the State as Throne and Altar alliances waxed and waned in their efficacy at spreading the Gospel. But she was extremely skeptical about these revolutions, especially as they seemed to involve the death of priests and the sacrilege of churches as part of their modernization program. The American Revolution may have been similar in some ways to these European revolts, but it was precisely the differences that made it a very different project than what came about in the Old World.

When Leo XIII came to the Throne of the Fisherman in 1878, he realized that the world had fundamentally changed to such a degree that Catholics had to learn to coexist with and contribute to a different world order than what had been before. At the same time, even this champion of modern democracy was not entirely convinced of the American project. In 1895, he wrote an encyclical called *Longinqua oceani* which was glowingly positive about the United States, even as it expressed a desire for greater public patronage of the Church. But four years later another encyclical, *Testem benevolentiae*, identified a heresy called *Americanism*.

The Pope identifies certain attitudes prevalent in America at the time with the country. Examples: the idea that the spiritual life is just an internal, private matter, and as such we can disobey the truths of the spiritual life in external, public life; the denigration of the contemplative religious life as "useless"; the idea that the faithful can decide doctrine for themselves; the idea that free speech is more important than responsible speech which encourages public morality; and the idea that Catholic parents can send their children to public or Protestant schools without being a danger to the faith.

Catholic politicians who are pro-life personally and pro-abortion professionally, Catholics who don't believe in the beauty of monastic life, Catholics who pick and choose what they want to believe like items in a cafeteria, Catholics who insist that their own individual liberties trump the common good, Catholics who expose their children to dangerous ideologies or false religions: none of that has one away. The concerns Pope Leo XIII had I20 years ago are still very much with us. Americanism is still a clear and present danger. Some American Catholic intellectuals have deliberately downplayed the Leonine teaching, or sought to twist it all out of shape to act like it actually supports the same ideas it condemns. A fascinating shift that is occurring now is the existence of self-identified traditional Catholics who will defend to the death every jot and tittle of pre-Vatican II papal authority and then turn right around and exalt individual liberties at the expense of the common good and brand the social teaching of the Church as just another leftist conspiracy. They then believe that the crisis of faith in the Church exonerates them from the duty of obedience. They then condemn as *false obedience* assent to anything that a new class of internet personalities identifies as pernicious to Catholic identity.

American Catholics have long been at pains to prove that they are both good Americans and good Catholics. But in that high wire act, there are many who are forgetting that we are Catholics first, and Americans second. The teaching of the Church is a powerful corrective to the relentless politicization of everything. If you want a unique examination of conscience to start off your new year, bring up *Testem benevolentiae* when you go to the Adoration Chapel next. You might have more food for thought than you ever realized!

celebrating the liturgical life of the church in YOUR home

6 January: The Epiphany of the Lord. The Solemnity of the Epiphany is celebrated either on January 6 or on the Sunday between January 2 and 8. This feast day marks the twelfth day of Christmas and celebrates the young Messiah being revealed as the light of the nations. In the Latin Rite of the Church, Epiphany (comes from the Greek, meaning "revelation" from above") celebrates the revelation that Jesus is the Son of God. It focuses primarily on this revelation to the Magi; but also in the baptism in the Jordan and the wedding at Cana. The Early Church celebrated the advent of Christ by commemorating the Nativity, Visitation of the Magi, Baptism of Christ and the Wedding of Cana all in one feast of the Epiphany. At the Council of Tours in 567, the Church set Christmas day and Epiphany as separate feasts, and named the twelve days between them as the Christmas season. The traditions surrounding the Feast of the Epiphany point to the Magi, the first gentiles to meet Christ. The Bible does not list the names or the number of the wise men, but we do know they were intelligent, wealthy, and brave. The gifts they brought to the Christ-child



(gold, frankincense and myrrh) were gifts that point not only to Christ's divinity and his revelation to the Magi as the King of Kings, but also to his crucifixion. Giving herbs traditionally used for burial was a foreshadowing of what is to come.

There are many Epiphany traditions around the world. In Italy, La Befana brings sweets and presents to children not on Christmas, but on Epiphany. Children in many parts of Latin America, the Philippines, Portugal, and Spain also receive their presents on "Three Kings Day" (children leave shoes out on the eve of Epiphany to receive treats and money from the Kings, similar to St. Nick's Day). In Ireland, Catholics celebrate "Women's Christmas" – women rest from housework and cleaning and celebrate with a special meal. In Germany, groups of young people called Sternsinger (Star Singers) travel door to door dressed as the three Wiseman, with the leader carrying a star. Germans eat a golden pastry ring filled with orange and spice representing gold, frankincense and myrrh. They decorate Christmas trees with cookies and sweets that are to be enjoyed on Epiphany. In England, the night before Epiphany is known as Twelfth Night. It is a time for plays, practical jokes, Twelfth Night Cake, and wassailing. The Yule Log was lit on Christmas day and remained burning until Epiphany. For Christians, the symbolism of the Yule log is that it represented keeping the stable warm for baby Jesus. These days, log shaped chocolate cakes are often eaten in place of the Yule logs.

Ideas for celebrating in your home:

- It is traditional to celebrate Epiphany with a Kings Cake: a sweet cake that contains an object like a plastic figure, bean or nut. If you get the bean, you are King or Queen for the day! Recipe here.
- Nativity scene: the infant Jesus could be given a small gold crown or regal robe. The figures of the wise men should have reached the manger by now!
- It is traditional to bless your home on Epiphany using blessed chalk (given out at church). Over the door is inscribed: 20 + C + M + B + 21. The initials CMB stand for the names of the Wisemen or for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means "May Christ bless this house"
- Put on a play: celebrate the three kings by asking children to act out the story of the Magi coming to visit the newborn king. Bedsheets and tablecloths make great robes and crowns can be homemade (tip: Burger King is happy to give out crowns to customers!). Children can carry the three gifts to the Christ-child in the manger: click here for how to make edible "gifts" that are symbolic of the gold, frankincense and myrrh. Be sure to sing "We Three Kings"!





COVID-19 policies, updated

All parish social events are on pause until further notice.

- In the PAC, those involved in parish athletic and ministry activities will receive notification from their leaders about new policies and protocols that go into effect immediately regarding the conditions under which those events and ministries can function. The School, RE, CYO and Choirs all have done an excellent job of putting together a protocol for temperature taking, masking when social distancing is impossible, and sanitizing. All other parish programs will be brought into alignment with those protocols. Because each program functions a little differently, you will receive specific notifications about each one. Failure to comply with the directives will mean that you will be asked to leave the property, and continued failure in this manner will mean the cessation of the specific ministry at this time.
- In the church: Because our church is larger than many of the other Catholic churches in town, it provides greater possibility for social distancing. When we came back to church, we asked people to responsibly distance themselves. We have encouraged people to mask when inside the building, according to the CDC recommendations. As more people come back to Mass, and social distancing becomes more challenging, it is more imperative to mask. Of course, there are some people that have legitimate medical or practical reasons why masking is not possible, and it is important that we respect that. However, it must be observed that, if masks are required in all enclosed public spaces in the area, it is reasonable to ask our people to mask unless they are otherwise unable to do so.

As COVID cases and deaths rise in Greenville County, we reserve the right to amend these instructions at any time. In the meantime, let us pray for an end to this pandemic, for the protection of caregivers, for the sick and dying, and for the repose of the souls of all who have passed during this time.
