Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the Commandments of the Church is: Respect the marriage laws of the Church. Because marriage is a sacrament, and not just a civil contract, the Church protects the true nature of this mystery with a discipline which is meant to allow it to thrive as a state of life for those called to it. I am continually surprised at how many people seem to be surprised when they learn of this discipline later, often after they have attempted marriage in a way which impairs their communion with the Church.

A Catholic marries a Catholic in the Catholic Church. That's the easiest way to put it. Now, because marriage is also a natural contract as well as a sacramental covenant, the power of the keys given to the apostles and their successors allows them to dispense from certain aspects of that discipline for a grave reason. A Catholic may be allowed to marry a non-Catholic if the Catholic party promises before God to raise the children as Catholics. This is crucial to head off the scourge of religious indifferentism which can ruin children's faith. A Catholic may be allowed to marry without the canonical form, that is the proper ceremony, and even in a non-sacred space, if there is a serious pastoral reason for it. Ordinarily, bishops are very reticent to give this permission, because often it is used to make a wedding into an event which hardly resembles the reality of Christian marriage.

Divorce is to be avoided whenever possible as a grave evil, but no Catholic can never remarry anyone anywhere. Just because the State has granted some form of civil separation, that does not mean we are free before God to enter into another union. An annulment is a declaration of nullity by an ecclesiastical tribunal that, on the day you said, "I do," there was some kind of pre-existing condition that invalidated that contract. That means that you are free to marry in church. Catholics who marry outside of the Church can obtain a lack of form annulment because of the very fact they attempted marriage outside of God's plan for it in the Church. Other annulments are more complicated, because the Church presumes the validity of a marriage.

Two baptized Christians, whether they are in full communion with the Catholic Church, contract a sacramental marriage which is indissoluble. Even though Protestants deny that marriage is a sacrament, Catholics believe that baptized Christians contract a marriage which is still sacramental regardless of whether the person is in full communion or not. Protestants are not bound to canonical form, which is why their marriage is considered valid even if they do not get married in a Catholic church. The Church binds her Catholic children to be married in a Catholic church (unless a dispensation is obtained) for validity.

A Catholic who is married outside of the Church can get married in the Church if there is no obstacle to both parties marrying in the Church. Catholics can have their marriage convalidated, as the term goes, if both parties are free to marry. In doing so, they exchange their vows before their pastor or his delegate, and their civil union then becomes a sacramental, indissoluble marriage. A Catholic who attempts marriage outside of the Church places himself out of full communion with the Church, and may not receive any of the sacraments, including confession, until the marriage is regularized or in danger of death. Sometimes Catholics in irregular marriage situations promise to live as brother and sister before the Bishop and are then allowed to return to the sacraments if that will not cause scandal.

A Catholic who wants to get married and is free to marry must be a registered, active and contributing member of his parish. At Prince of Peace, we require six months of activity that can be tracked by use of the envelope system before the six month process of marriage preparation can even begin. Encouraging Catholics, who are not practicing their faith, to contract a sacramental marriage in Church is putting the cart before the horse, so to speak, and almost guarantees a marriage contracted in sacrilege and mortal sin, indifferentist raising of children, and breakdown of the integrity of discipleship in the life of the Church.




Celebrating the Liturgical Life of the Church

3 May: Feast of Saints Philip and James, Apostles. For centuries, the Church had feasts to honor only four apostles: Sts. Peter and Paul, St. John, St. Andrew. The Church memorialized the remaining apostles on June 29. Then, in the sixth century, the bodies of Sts. Philip and James were brought together to Rome and laid to rest in the Basilica of the Holy Apostles. Because of this, the Church instituted a shared feast day for these two apostles.

St. James the Less, a brother of the Apostle Jude, was of Cana of Galilee. He was referred to as "the Less" to distinguish him from the other apostle James (the



brother of John). This nickname likely refers to his younger age, not that he was any less important. This James was called "the brother of the Lord," because his mother was related to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Jesus appeared to James before any other apostle after the resurrection (I Cor I5:7). James is the author of the *Epistle of St. James*. He became bishop of the Church in Jerusalem and played a central role in the Church's first council (Acts I5). He confirmed that Gentiles do not need circumcision to follow Christ. In 62 A.D., Jewish leaders accused James of breaking the Law. He was pressured to deny the Divinity of Christ. The *Breviary* contains a moving description of his death: "When he was ninety-six years old and had governed the Church for thirty years in a most holy manner, the Jews sought to stone him, then took him to the pinnacle of the temple and cast him off headlong. As he lay there half dead, with legs broken by the fall, he lifted his hands toward heaven and prayed to God for the salvation of his enemies, saying: Lord, forgive them for they know not what they do! While the apostle was still praying, a fuller struck his head a mortal blow."

As for St. Philip, he was one of the first apostles called by Christ. The day after the Lord called the apostles Peter and Andrew, He found Philip in Galilee. Philip was one of the first apostles to come to faith directly through Christ (Jn I:43-45). Philip believed in Christ as soon as he encountered Him, after hearing only a few words. Philip also speaks during the Last Supper in the Gospel of John after Jesus says, "No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you will know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him." To which Philip replies, "Lord, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us" Jesus answered, "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (Jn I4:6-9). In the end, Philip followed in the footsteps of James and many other apostles by being martyred for his faith. After preaching with Bartholomew in Greece, he was scourged, imprisoned, and crucified upside down in 62 A.D. Though Philip and James served as apostles of Christ in different ways, in the end, they both valiantly gave their lives for Christ.

Ideas for celebrating this feast at home:

- Read the **Epistle of St. James**
- Make "Apostle Cookies" (instructions here)
- For dinner, make "Middle Eastern rice with black beans and chickpeas" (recipe here). Or, make an Israeli feast in honor of the apostles' lewish heritage (hummus, olives, veggies, pita, falafel, etc)
- Because St. Philip is the patron saint of pastry chefs and St. James the patron of hatmakers, it might be fun wear
 hats at dinner tonight. A fitting dessert would be a pastry treat; <u>click here</u> for some delicious puff pastry recipes.
